On this tour you will go on a beautiful chairlift ride up to STF Aurora Sky Station. Enjoy the stillness of the Abisko National Park by night on your way up to the aurora watching point at an altitude of 900 metres.

Itinerary

20:30 Meet your host at the front desk for the walk to the chairlift. Or walk on your own along the 950 metres, lit, trail.

Warm clothes and a dressing room are available at the chairlift station. See important information.

21:00 The chairlift to STF Aurora Sky Station opens. Approximately 30 minutes ride. A host will assist you to get off the chairlift – don't jump off at the middle station! Last ascent at 24:00.

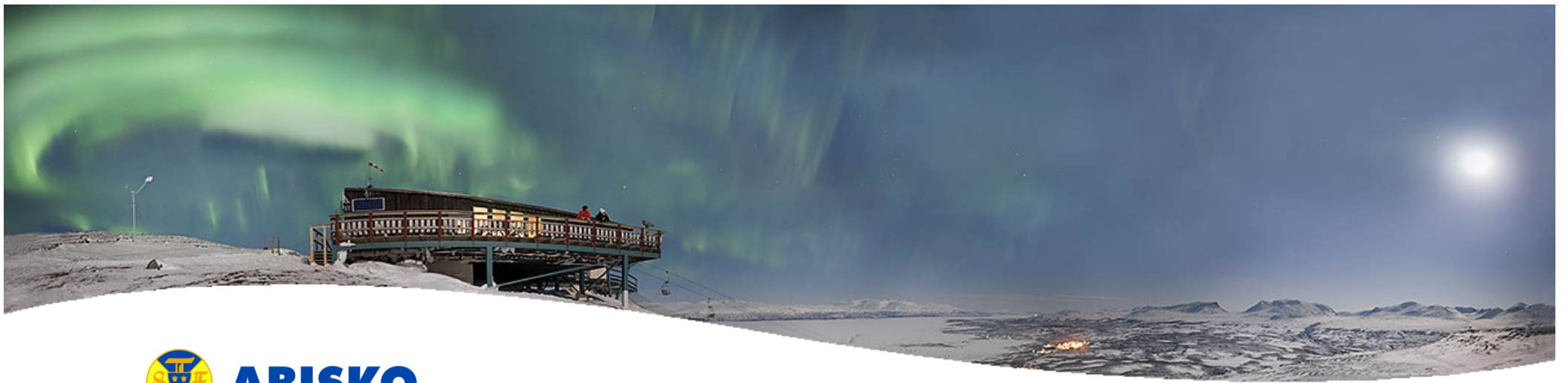
22:00 Guided northern lights tours are offered at 22:00, 22:30, 23:00 and 23:30. Join at any time you want and spend the rest of the evening aurora hunting on your own.

You may take the chairlift down at any time you wish.

01:00 Last descent. Follow the lights from the chairlift station back to the hotel.

Important information

- You may take the chairlift up at any time after 21:00 and go down at any time before 01:00.
- You will spend most of the evening outdoors – walking to the chairlift, in the chairlift and while aurora hunting at STF Aurora Sky Station. You might experience the coldest weather in your life, but that's not a problem as long as you dress accordingly.
- At STF Aurora Sky Station there is a cosy café and a small souvenir shop where you may go inside and warm up by the fire – however, the auroras are outdoors!
- Wear your own warmest winter gear. Overalls to put on top of your own clothes as well as warm boots are available at the chair lift station. Hats and gloves are not provided; you must bring your own.
- Please note – the walk to the chairlift is slightly uphill. If you get warm, ease or take off some of your clothing but put it on before getting on the lift. For safety reasons, staff at the chairlift has the right to refuse service to those not dressed properly.
- Warm clothes, camera and money/credit card for drinks and souvenirs are the only things you need to bring. If you are not used to walk on snow and ice, slip protection for your shoes may be useful. Available in the shop at the hotel.
- The toilets at STF Aurora Sky Station and at the base of the chairlift are outhouses, dry toilets.
- Taking good pictures of the northern light requires a camera with "bulb mode", self-timer (or cable release) and manual focus option. Preferably also a tripod. You may get some photo tips from our guide or at the hotel reception.
- There are no aurora guarantees! Although Abisko is one of the best places on the planet to see the northern lights it is still a natural phenomenon and we can just hope for the sun activity to be strong and the weather clear when you are visiting us. There are no refunds when there are no auroras.
- We are in the Arctic and the cold and the winds may sometimes be extreme. When the STF Aurora Sky Station chairlift is closed on short notice for safety reasons there will be an alternative program around the hotel. The staff will inform you. There are no refunds when the chairlift is closed due to hard weather.

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
