



Abisko – Cave adventure

The Kåppasjokk caves form one of Sweden's longest cave systems, with winding passages and tunnels extending deep into the bedrock. Join us for an adventure in this fascinating and thrilling cave network.

One of Sweden's longest cave systems lies hidden beside a stream near Abisko. We'll pack up our caving gear and drive a few kilometers westward, then hike up the mountain slope to the cave entrance, Kåppashåla. Upon arrival, we'll suit up with coveralls, helmets, and headlamps before descending underground. Your guide will lead you through a maze of narrow passages, large chambers, and incredible formations shaped by nature's forces over thousands of years. When it's time to head back, we'll hike down along Kåppasjåkka, where we'll also discover waterfalls and giant's kettles (also known as a glacial pothole).

Make sure to bring warm clothes as the temperature in the caves seldomly reach more than 8 degrees Celsius.

Transportation	Transportation in a minivan back and forth to Björkliden, where the hike to the cave starts
Equipment	<p>Caving overalls, rubber boots, helmet, and headlamp are included.</p> <p>Note! Bring waterproof clothing, the overalls are not waterproof, but they protect your clothing from the sharp rocks in the cave. We also recommend you bring a pair of simple, thin gloves to protect your hands</p>
Guide	This tour is led by a guide certified according to the Swedish "Fjälledarnormen"
Other	<p>The program can be changed due to challenging weather or other unforeseeable events.</p> <p>Cancellation can be made up to 7 days before arrival, after that no refunds will be made</p>

<p>The easiest way to get to Abisko is by train.
