Abisko - Advanced alpine ski touring course

This course is for those who have previous experience in alpine ski touring and avalanche knowledge and are now looking to take the next step in your development. Abisko offers the perfect ski terrain to develop and refine your summit touring skills.

Over three intense days, we will build on your existing knowledge of avalanche safety, skiing techniques, and tour planning. After the course, the goal is for you to feel ready to plan and carry out your own dream tours. After great days outdoor, we will recover with good food and pleasant company at STF Abisko Turiststation.

This is an alpine ski touring course, not an alpine climbing or glacier course.

Preliminary program

Day 1:

We gather in Abisko Turiststation at 5.00 p.m. for information about the program for the following days, before we have a three-course dinner together in Restaurant Kungsleden.

Day 2-4:

Full days outdoors where we practice different techniques both uphill and downhill. Focus on efficient and energy-saving movement. We will also develop our buddy rescue skills, practice dealing with both single and multiple burials, and discuss route selection in avalanche terrain. We will also learn how to handle map and compass so that after the course, you can plan and carry out your own tours. We'll review packing – necessary and unnecessary equipment. The focus is on becoming a confident summit tourer.

EQUIPMENT	
Recommended equipment:	 Wind shelter (shared among the group) First aid kit (guide's responsibility) Shell clothing, unlined is recommended Hat (preferably two: one thinner or a headband, and one warmer) Two pairs of gloves, preferably one thinner, windproof pair for the ascent and a warmer pair for the descent Two base layers (synthetic or wool) Wool or synthetic socks, two to three pairs Insulating jacket (down or synthetic) Fleece sweater or other mid-layer Sunglasses and goggles Headlamp with extra batteries Thermos Water bottle, you should be able to carry at least 1–1.5 L (insulated is optimal) Sunscreen and blister tape Your own preferred snacks Map and compass
Good to have	 Camera Insulated shorts – down or Primaloft shorts



Necessary ski equipment

(Necessary ski equipment for the event is available for rent)

- Touring skis or Splitboard
- Boots (walk mode required)
- Ski helmet (mandatory)
- Avalanche equipment: shovel, probe, and transceiver (analog transceivers not allowed)
- Backpack, 35–40 liters

INSURANCE DURING STF ACTIVITIES

The guide is trained in wilderness first aid and will do everything possible to minimize potential risks during the activity. However, participants should be aware of the risks they are exposing themselves to, and we require that participants have the correct equipment as outlined above, and follow the guide's instructions.

If you are a member of STF and participate in an activity organized by STF, you are covered by an accident insurance policy during the activity. The insurance also covers children accompanying members up to the age of 15, as well as leaders and cabin hosts at STF.
