# Abisko - Intro to alpine ski-touring

Do you want to learn how to plan and carry through alpine ski-touring tours on your own? To be able to lay the first tracks down untouched mountain sides? In the area around Abisko there are endless peaks and possibilities, making this an excellent place for an introduction to alpine ski-touring.

During three intense days, your competent guide will teach you the basic skills needed to go ski-touring on your own. You'll learn about equipment, technique for both the uphill and downhill, basic avalanche safety and mountain safety. We live comfortably and eat well at STF Abisko Turiststation to be able to relax after long and rewarding days in the mountains.

### Preliminary program

#### Day 1

We gather in Abisko Turiststation at 5.00 p.m. for information about the program for the following days, before we have a three-course dinner together in Restaurant Kungsleden.

#### Day 2

We spend the first day on Mt. Nuolja, here we have some great places to practice avalanche rescue (searching for buried transceivers, probing, and digging). This is also a good place to get familiar with all the equipment and do a first easy ski-tour out of bounds.

#### Day 3-4

We move and ski varied terrain on the mountains surrounding Abisko. We choose the mountain of the day depending on the current weather and snow conditions, and travel to the best spots by minivan. The riding is with practical and theoretical avalanche knowledge, and other things that are good to know for future ski-touring on your own. We finish the tour on day 4 around 4.00 p.m. and you'll be back in time to catch the afternoon train heading south.

Included equipment (Divided between the participants)	<ul> <li>Bivy bag</li> <li>Avalanche equipment (transceiver, probe, shovel)</li> <li>First aid kit (guide)</li> </ul>
Recommended equipment	<ul> <li>Randonée-, telemark- or splitboard equipment (with climbing skins) for riding off-piste</li> <li>Ski-/snowboard boots (with walk-mode)</li> <li>Ski poles</li> <li>Helmet</li> <li>1-2 base layers, wool or synthetic</li> <li>Warm layer in fleece, wool or softshell</li> <li>Shell clothing without insulation (the jacket should have a helmet-compatible hood)</li> <li>At least 2 pairs of skiing socks (preferably woolen or with a wool mix)</li> <li>Warm layer for breaks (light down- or synthetic jacket)</li> <li>2 pairs of gloves/mittens</li> <li>Beanie and/or headband/buff (for the uphill)</li> <li>Thermos and water bottle</li> <li>Sunglasses and ski goggles</li> <li>Sun cream</li> <li>Sports tape (for blister prevention)</li> <li>Backpack, 35-45L (suitable for ski-touring, so they can carry your probe, shovel, and helmet)</li> <li>Try packing your backpack at home to make sure</li> </ul>
	everything fits. Pack light.
Nice to have	<ul> <li>Slippers (for the evenings at Abisko Turiststation)</li> <li>Extra underwear, socks, gloves, sweater</li> <li>Comfortable clothes for the evenings at Abisko Turiststation</li> <li>Sitting pad</li> </ul>
Rental in Abisko	If you need to rent some equipment you can do that in the shop at Abisko Turiststation. As a member of STF and a participant in one of our courses you get a 15 % discount on rentals.
