



ABISKO – Autumn hike

Embark on an unforgettable autumn hike with our guide! Journey through a stunning landscape painted in vibrant reds, oranges, and yellows while learning about the area's rich nature, culture, and history. You might even find some berries to pick!

Mountain hikers' favorite season: Autumn. Among golden birches and crisp air, we invite you to the Panorama Hike on Njulla, the area's best.

With a chairlift, we ascend for breathtaking views of the Abisko Alps. This 10 km tour is mostly downhill towards the dramatic Kårsavagge Valley, where you can glimpse glaciers. We pass babbling brooks and mossy resting spots. Here you might also spot hares and ptarmigans transforming for winter.

The hike continues through Abisko National Park, where golden birches and gnarled pines create a landscape filled with hidden treasures like lingonberries, blueberries, and cranberries. The tour concludes along the rushing waters of Abiskojåkka, a perfect end to a hike offering the ultimate mix of vast views, autumn forests, and babbling brooks. Join us on best hike of the autumn.

PRELIMINARY PROGRAM

We will meet at the entrance to the tourist station at 9:30 AM.

Afterward, we'll walk along the start of the Kungsleden trail toward the Njulla valley station. Here, we'll take the lift up to the mountain station and enjoy the fantastic views.

At the mountain station, we'll pass the Aurora Sky Station and then turn down toward the Kårsavagge valley, following the path for about 4 km. Most of the elevation descent happens along this section. Along the path, we'll look for the best lunch spot with the most beautiful mountain views over the Abisko Alps and Lapporten.

Down in the Kårsavagge valley at the trail intersection, we'll follow the path downhill along the stream Kårsajåkka until it merges with Abiskojåkkas, which will lead us back to the tourist station for about 6 km. We'll stop at the streams to refill our water and have a snack.

ABOUT THE AREA

Abisko is located 250 km north of the Arctic Circle and attracts visitors from all over the world to experience the polar nights in winter, where the northern lights dance across the sky, and the endless light of the midnight sun in summer.

The tourist station is situated in one of Sweden's first national parks – Abisko National Park – and serves as the perfect starting point for those who want to stay comfortably while exploring the magnificent nature. To the south, the Kungsleden trail stretches between the iconic Lapporten – known as Čuonjavággi in Sami – and Mount Njulla on the other side. To the north, just before the Norwegian border, lies Scandinavia's largest alpine lake, Torneträsk. From here, you can join guided tours, rent equipment, or get help planning your own adventure. With its unique combination of dramatic landscapes, accessible outdoor activities, polar phenomena, and biological diversity, Abisko is a place that inspires and touches the soul.

FIND YOUR WAY HERE

The easiest way to travel to Abisko is by train, as the platform is located right outside the tourist station.

Another option is to fly to Kiruna and continue by bus or train to Abisko.
