



ABISKO – CLASSIC HIKES

Abisko is a hiker's paradise! Join us for a week filled with delightful day trips in the magnificent surroundings of Abisko. Each day takes us to a new destination, where a captivating experience awaits.

Surrounded by good company and a supportive guide, we hike through beautiful landscapes with vast, sweeping views, valleys with boulders as large as houses, and past historically significant areas with ancient sacrificial sites. We will hike along well-hiked trails and through less-visited areas.

It will be a week of exploring magnificent surrounding, combined with the luxury of each day returning to the warmth of the tourist station. Here, deliciously prepared dinners await, helping you recover and recharge for the upcoming days.

The grand finale of the week is a soothing session in the wood-fired sauna by Lake Torneträsk, perfect for sore feet and tired muscles. If you're feeling brave, take a dip in the lake and let the warmth of the sauna meet the icy, crystal-clear water. We end the evening with a three-course dinner at Restaurant Kungsleden.

PRELIMINARY PROGRAM
<p>Day 1: Gathering at 5 PM, after the arrival of the late train. We welcome you, and the guide provides an overview of the upcoming week while answering any questions you may have. After the briefing, we enjoy a shared three-course dinner at Restaurant Kungsleden.</p> <p>Day 2: The first hike takes us to the well-known destination of Geargejávri, located deep in the Kärkevaggi valley, also commonly known as Trollsjön (Troll Lake). This area holds significant geological value, shaped by powerful natural forces over thousands of years. The landscape is like something out of a fairytale, with towering cliffs enclosing the rugged boulder terrain, which transitions into a delta and blooming meadows.</p> <p>Day 3: After breakfast, during which you prepare your packed lunch for the day, we take the cable car up to Nuolja. We make a short stop at STF Aurora Sky Station before</p>

following the trail called "Glidaren" down toward the Kårsavagge valley. This hike is mostly downhill and offers magnificent views of the entire Abisko valley. Some sections may be slightly wet, and at one point, the descent becomes a bit steeper before we reach the valley floor. The diverse flora transitions from alpine tundra to lush birch forest, with the trail winding along the stream back to the tourist station.

Day 4: Today, we lace up our hiking boots and head towards Sweden's highest mountain station – Låktatjåkko! After a short bus ride, we begin our hike of approximately 9 km and 750 meters of elevation gain one way. Once at the top, you can reward yourself with the famous "Låktawaffle" before we hike back down again.

Day 5: For today's hike you need to pack a full lunch pack at breakfast. We once again take the cable car up to Nuolja, then hike to the summit, offering spectacular panoramic views in every direction. From there, we traverse off-trail toward the path that leads down to Björkliden. The terrain is partly unmarked and steep, but we take our time and enjoy the stunning views. We follow the stream, Kåppasjokk down to Björkliden, where a car awaits to take us back.

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Day 6: The week ends after breakfast.

ABOUT THE AREA

Abisko is located 250 km north of the Arctic Circle and attracts visitors from all over the world to experience the polar nights in winter, where the northern lights dance across the sky, and the endless light of the midnight sun in summer.

The tourist station is situated in one of Sweden's first national parks – Abisko National Park – and serves as the perfect starting point for those who want to stay comfortably while exploring the magnificent nature. To the south, the Kungsleden trail stretches between the iconic Lappporten – known as Čuonjavággi in Sami – and Mount Njulla on the other side. To the north, just before the Norwegian border, lies Scandinavia's largest alpine lake, Torneträsk.

From here, you can join guided tours, rent equipment, or get help planning your own adventure. With its unique combination of dramatic landscapes, accessible outdoor activities, polar phenomena, and biological diversity, Abisko is a place that inspires and touches the soul.

FIND YOUR WAY HERE

The easiest way to travel to Abisko is by train, as the platform is located right outside the tourist station.

Another option is to fly to Kiruna and continue by bus or train to Abisko.
